

Indoor Residential Water Budget Guide



Securing Your Water Supply

The indoor residential water budget is 60 gallons per person per day. The following table shows the number of billing units allocated indoors for a range of billing periods and persons per household.

- Indoor water budgets do not change from season to season.
- Indoor residential water budget values are held constant by the number of residents, the number of days in the billing period, and the gallons per person per day (60).
